There are a plethora of attractive pubs, cafes and specialist shops. For those looking for fine food, Warwick has a superb and ever enhancing reputation for restaurants ensuring that no-one ever goes without sampling quality.

Perhaps the most famous attraction is Warwick Castle which was voted Britain's best castle in 2003 and begun by William the Conqueror in 1068. Visitors can enjoy the Great Hall and State Rooms, the Dungeon and Torture Chamber as well as special events, such as jousting in the summer.

Among the architectural gems of our mediaeval history is the Guildhall, now the Lord Leycester Hospital, as well as a group of timber framed buildings around Oken's House which lies between the Castle walls and the town's Tourist Information Centre on Jury Street.

For those keen on the sport of royals, Warwick Racecourse plays host to a regular programme of meetings throughout the year. Other events in the town throughout the year include the established and highly popular Warwick Festival, Warwick Folk Festival and the Literary Festival all of which attract high quality performances and add to the unique atmosphere which the town enjoys.
